

## WYNDHAM INVITATIONAL PRESENTED BY ODYSSEY

### NOTICE TO PLAYERS

Play is governed by the Rules of Golf Effective January 2023 and the AJGA Tournament Hard Card. **Disregard any local rules on the Sedgefield Country Club scorecard or any other posted local rules.** In addition, the following specific rules apply:

1. **FORMAT:** 54 holes of stroke play. **There is NO CUT.** The competition will not extend beyond Thursday, June 11, 2026.
2. **TOURNAMENT TEES:** Play will be from the **Wyndham Invitational** tees.
3. **PRACTICE FACILITIES:** The following areas at Sedgefield Country Club are designated as practice facilities and can be used by AJGA participants: both practice putting greens, the driving range and the short game area. The short game area will not be available after play. Practice facilities not listed are closed to AJGA participants.
4. **STARTING POINT:** The starting point for Nos. 1 & 10 is defined by the stake and rope and blue stake.
5. **OUT OF BOUNDS:** Out of Bounds is defined by the inside edge of public roads, white stakes, property fence posts or walls at ground level. When defined by a white line, the line itself is out of bounds. Out of Bounds also includes the following:
  - Out of Bounds behind No. 9 green is defined by the outside edge of the cart path bordering the Champions Wall.
  - Out of Bounds left of No. 9 green is defined by the patio edge. White dots connect the patio to the cart path and define Out of Bounds.
  - Out of Bounds left and right of the greens on Nos. 4, 7, 10 and 11 extends across the private drive behind them. Out of Bounds is defined by white dots on the private drive. A ball coming to rest within these white dots is in bounds. The private drive is an immovable obstruction.
  - The stone wall left of the forward tees and fairway on No. 15 defines Out of Bounds.

**NOTE:** If a ball crosses a public roadway defining out of bounds and comes to rest on another part of the course, the ball is Out of Bounds.

6. **RED PENALTY AREA – NO. 2:** The red penalty area at the bridge on No. 2 is defined by the side of the stone wall adjacent to the red stakes on either end. For a ball in the general area, the stone wall is an obstruction from which players may get free relief in accordance with Rule 16.1.
7. **POWER LINES:** If it is known or virtually certain that a player's ball hit a power line, tower, pole or wires supporting the power line during the play of a hole, the stroke does not count and the player must replay without penalty the stroke by playing the original ball or another ball from the spot where stroke was made (See Rule 14.6).
8. **RELIEF FROM SEAMS OF CUT TURF:** If a player's ball lies in or touches a seam of cut turf or a seam interferes with the player's area of intended swing:
  - Ball in General Area: The player may take relief under Rule 16.1b.

**NOTE:** Interference does not exist if the seam only interferes with the player's stance. All seams within the area of cut turf are treated as the same seam in taking relief. This means that if a player has interference from any seam after dropping the ball, the player must proceed as required under Rule 14.3c(2) even when the ball is still within one club-length of the reference point.

9. **OBSTRUCTIONS:**
  - Bushes surrounding electrical boxes are considered to be part of the obstruction.
  - When a split rail fence borders a public roadway, the road defines Out of Bounds, and the fence is an obstruction.
10. **ADVICE: (Rule 10.2a)** is any verbal comment or action that is intended to influence a player in choosing a club, making a stroke or deciding how to play during a hole or round. In addition, any conversation between player/spectator may be construed as advice. This includes any conversation between player/spectator in their native language. In either instance penalty for breach of this rule is two strokes. Players are responsible for the actions of their relatives and spectators in regards to this rule.
11. **COMMITTEE:** The Committee, as defined in the Rules of Golf, consists of the senior rules official, all AJGA staff members present during competition, and any guest rules officials appointed by the tournament director. The Tournament Rules Committee composed of Senior Rules Official Larry Startzel, Tournament Director Doug Camp and Assistant Tournament Director Jacob Kennedy have final decision-making authority over all rules-related matters.
