NOTICE TO PLAYERS

Play is governed by the Rules of Golf Effective January 2023 and the AJGA Tournament Hard Card. **Disregard any local rules on the Regents' Glen Country Club scorecard or any other posted local rules.** In addition, the following specific rules apply:

1. **FORMAT**: 18 holes of stroke play. The competition will not extend beyond Thursday, July 9, 2026.
2. **TOURNAMENT TEES**: **Boys** will be playing from the **BLUE** tees.
Girls will be playing from the **WHITE** tees.
3. **PRACTICE FACILITIES**: The following areas at Regents' Glen Country Club are designated as practice facilities and can be used by AJGA participants: The practice putting green (range), the practice green (No. 1), the practice chipping green, and the driving range. Practice facilities not listed are closed to AJGA participants.
4. **OUT OF BOUNDS**: In addition to white stakes, fence posts and white painted lines, out of bounds is defined by;
 - the golf course side edge of the sidewalks or cart paths on holes Nos. 4, 5, 6, 10, 11, 12.
 - The course side edge at ground level of erosion barriers on holes 4, 6, and 7.
 - When out of bounds is defined by white lines, sidewalks, cart paths or erosion barriers, white stakes with a blue tape ribbon around them identify those nearby objects as what defines the edge of out bounds.
 - Stakes with green painted tops have no significance in course marking.
5. **IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS**:
 - Erosion barriers on the course and stakes holding them in place are immovable obstructions. (Exception: erosion barriers used to define out of bounds are boundary objects from which free relief is not available.)
 - **DROP ZONE**: In the play of No. 2, if a player has interference from the rest room building and /or any of the cart paths surrounding it, as an additional option under Rule 16.1 (Abnormal Course Conditions [Including Immovable Obstructions]), the player may drop the original or another ball in the AJGA-DZ (drop zone), right of and behind the putting green.
6. **POWER LINES**: If it is known or virtually certain that a player's ball hit a power line [or tower or a wire or pole supporting a power line] during the play of No. 2 and No. 3, the stroke does not count. The player must play a ball without penalty from where the previous stroke was made (see rule 14.6 for what to do)
 - If the player replays the stroke but does so from a wrong place, they get the general penalty under Rule 14.7a.
 - If the player does not replay the stroke, they get the general penalty and the stroke counts, but the player has not played from a wrong place.
7. **ADVICE**: (Rule 10.2a) is any verbal comment or action that is intended to influence a player in choosing a club, making a stroke, or deciding how to play during a hole or round. In addition, any conversation between player/spectator may be construed as advice. This includes any conversation between player/spectator in their native language. In either instance penalty for breach of this rule is two strokes. Players are responsible for the actions of their relatives and spectators in regards to this rule.
8. **COMMITTEE**: The Committee, as defined in the Rules of Golf, consists of the senior rules official, all AJGA staff members present during the competition, and any guest rules officials appointed by the tournament director. The Tournament Rules Committee composed of Senior Rules Official David Staebler, Tournament Director Rob Cleary and Tournament Assistant Kaylee Sakoda, will have final decision-making authority over all rules-related matters.
